



SUMMER STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

General Information on Financial Aid and Scholarships for Summer Study Abroad

Emory Summer Programs: All Emory College students and Oxford students who qualify are considered by the Office of Financial Aid for a summer aid award after registration in Emory summer study abroad courses. The amount of the award, ranging from 35% up to 95% of tuition, depends on the number of credit hours and current financial aid package. Students currently receiving financial aid from Emory are typically eligible. A limited number of CIPA Summer Study Abroad Travel Grants are also available.

Types of Financial Aid

Grants and Scholarships: Usually provide funding that does not need to be repaid, based on talent, financial need or affiliation. Types of aid include Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, Emory University Grants, Georgia Tuition Equalization / HOPE Grant, Georgia Student Incentive Grant, Student Courtesy Scholarship, and outside scholarships (such as government, corporate or community agency funding). Scholarships listed under "Other Resources for Study Abroad" are administered by outside institutions.

Loans: Are available from various sources, including federal and state governments, the University and private lenders. Students must pay back student loans. Types of loans include: Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Subsidized Stafford Loan, Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, Federal PLUS Loans, and Emory University Loans.

CIPA Summer Study Abroad Travel Grant

The need-based CIPA Study Abroad Grant encourages Emory College undergraduates to participate in Emory summer study abroad programs. Emory students currently receiving financial aid through Emory's Office of Financial Aid may submit an application for the travel grant. The grant can be used to offset airfare and other travel-related expenses for an Emory-approved summer program abroad.

General Eligibility Requirements: To be eligible for the grant, students must:

- Be enrolled as an Emory College undergraduate.
- Have and maintain at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA.
- Return to Emory for at least one semester or more after the completion of the program.
- Have applied and been accepted to an eligible study abroad program.
- Priority given to students receiving need based financial aid.

Deadline: Students must submit the CIPA Summer Study Abroad Travel Grant Application (on-line) beginning **January 4, 2010** and physically turn in a copy of their unofficial transcript to CIPA as a Material Submission by **March 1, 2010**.

Award: The precise amount of each award will be determined by the Selection Committee.

Archaeological Studies in Tell Halif, Israel

Archaeological Institute of America – Jane C. Waldbaum Archaeological Field School Scholarship

- The Archaeological Institute of America is pleased to announce the Waldbaum Field School Scholarship. Established in honor of AIA Past President Jane Waldbaum, this scholarship provides \$1000 each for up to five successful applicants to help pay expenses associated with participation on an archaeological excavation or survey project (minimum stay: one month). The scholarship is open to junior and senior undergraduate students and first-year graduate students who are currently enrolled at a college or university in the U.S. or Canada. Applicants must be at least 18 years old and have not previously participated in an archaeological excavation. Students majoring in archaeology or related disciplines are especially encouraged to apply.

APA-AIA Minority Scholarship

• The Joint Committee on Minority Scholarships of the American Philological Association (APA) and the Archaeological Institute of America (AIA) invites applications from minority undergraduate students for a scholarship to be awarded for **Summer 2009**. The purpose of the scholarship is to further an undergraduate's preparation for graduate work in classics or classical archaeology. Eligible proposals might include (but are not limited to) participation in summer programs or field schools in Italy, Greece, Egypt, etc., or language training at institutions in the U.S, Canada, or Europe. The maximum amount of the award will be \$3,000.

• Candidates will be judged on the basis of (a) their academic qualifications, especially in classics, including demonstrated ability in at least one classical language, or in fields that prepare a student to become a classical archaeologist, (b) the quality of their proposal for study particularly as preparation for a career in classics or classical archaeology, and (c) need. The application must be supported by a member of the APA or the AIA.

• **The deadline for receipt of application is Friday, December 12, 2008.** We will announce the result by January 30, 2009. Applicants should submit (1) a letter of application describing the applicant's plans for Summer 2009 and his/her broader career goals; (2) an undergraduate transcript; (3) two letters of recommendation by faculty members or other professionals who have worked with the student during the past two years (at least one of these must be an APA or AIA member). One letter should state that the applicant is a member of a "minority." NOTE: in "minority" we include African-American, Hispanic-American, Asian-American and Native-American students. Applications should be submitted to the APA Office in Philadelphia at the address below.

• Students who are majoring in English, History, or Music and who will be studying abroad on the summer British Studies program at Regents Park College are eligible to apply for this scholarship. The English, History, or Music major must be officially confirmed on the Emory transcript to be submitted as part of the application materials. Students must take at least one class in one of these areas while studying abroad. The minimum GPA required is 3.5. This scholarship can be used to offset living expenses during the study abroad program, including airfare, housing, meals, and other travel-related costs. The exact amount of the scholarship will be determined by the selection committee.

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship

Eligibility

To be eligible applicants must be majoring in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math (STEM) field. This pilot cycle for summer 2010 is only open to students in the STEM fields who meet the standard eligibility criteria listed below.

- The applicant must be receiving a Federal Pell Grant at the time of application or during the term of his/her study program.
- The applicant is applying to or has been accepted into a study abroad program eligible for credit by the student's accredited institution of higher education in the U.S.
- The applicant is studying abroad in any country except Cuba or a country on the U.S. Department of State's current Travel Warning list.
- Applicants are not required to study a STEM subject while abroad to be eligible for the scholarship.

Application Deadlines

Applications for the Summer 2010 will be available during both the Fall and Spring application cycles. Students are strongly encouraged to submit their applications during the first application cycle (by the October 6, 2009 deadline) to ensure timely notification of award. Applicants who miss the October 6, 2009 deadline can apply during the second award cycle, but will not be notified of their award status until the first week of May.

Award Details

125 scholarships will be awarded to students studying abroad during the Summer of 2010. These awards will be up to \$5,000 with an average award of \$ 3,000.

The online application for Summer study abroad programs is the same as the application for students going abroad during fall, Spring or Academic Year terms. The advisor certification process will also be the same for Summer 2010 applications.

Corinne Jeannine Schillings Foundation – Academic Scholarship to Study a Foreign Language

- The *Foundation* will award scholarships to deserving young women who have attained at least the honor of **Silver Award Girl Scout**, and who plan to or are currently pursuing a major/minor in foreign language at a four year college/university. The scholarship provides \$1,500 per academic year. The scholarship may be renewed three times following the initial award, for a total \$6,000 maximum award. Scholarship renewal is **not** automatic, however, and awardees must submit the renewal application and all required attachments each year.

National Security Education Program (NSEP)

The merit based NSEP scholarships are designed to strengthen national security by providing opportunities for students to study cultures and languages important to U.S. national security. The NSEP expands international educational opportunities for U.S. students, particularly those who may have little or no previous experience overseas and who may need financial assistance to participate in study abroad. NSEP requirements include selecting a program of study in all countries except for Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand. The integrated study of foreign language is required for all proposals. All recipients of the award are required to complete a service component as part of the scholarship program. The maximum award is \$8,000 for summer, \$10,000 for semester, and \$20,000 for academic year.
