

SUMMER STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

General Information on Financial Aid and Scholarships for Summer Study Abroad

Emory Summer Programs: All Emory undergraduate students who qualify are considered by the Office of Financial Aid for a summer aid award after registration in Emory summer study abroad courses. The amount of the award, which is a percentage of tuition costs, depends on the number of credit hours and current financial aid package. Students currently receiving financial aid from Emory are typically eligible.

Types of Financial Aid

Grants and Scholarships: Usually provide funding that does not need to be repaid, based on talent, financial need, or affiliation. Types of aid include Emory University Grant, Georgia Tuition Equalization Grant, HOPE Scholarship, Student Courtesy Scholarship, Emory Merit Scholarships, and outside scholarships (such as government, corporate, or community agency funding). Scholarships listed under "Other Resources for Study Abroad" are administered by outside institutions.

Loans: Are available from various sources, including federal and state governments, the University, and private lenders. Students must pay back student loans. Types of loans include: Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Subsidized Stafford Loan, Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, and Federal PLUS Loans.

- Demonstrate financial need
- Have not been abroad before

British Studies, England

Dewey-Hinton Scholarship

• Students who are majoring in English, History, or Music and who will be studying abroad on the summer British Studies program in Oxford are eligible to apply for this scholarship. The English, History, or Music major must be officially confirmed on the Emory transcript to be submitted as part of the application materials. Students must take at least one class in one of these areas while studying abroad. The minimum GPA required is 3.5. Summer awards range from \$1,500 to \$3,000.

German Studies in Vienna, Austria

Max Kade Scholarship

Emory students who are planning to participate on the German Studies Program in Vienna, Austria are eligible to apply for the Max Kade Scholarship. The scholarship will sponsor four \$4,000 scholarships to enable students from the Department of German Studies of Emory University to participate in the Vienna Summer Program. Two scholarships are for students who will take Intermediate German 201/202 in Vienna, and the other two scholarships for students who will take third-year German 370 A/B in Vienna. Recipients are selected on the basis of (1) financial need, (2) academic merit, and (3) strength of application and recommendation. German majors and minors will receive preference.

Italian Studies in Rome, Italy

Davidson Medicine and Compassion Scholar Award

Emory students who are planning to participate on the Italian Studies summer study abroad program in Italy are eligible to apply for the Davidson Medicine and Compassion Scholar Award which can be used to supplement the costs of their program. The exact amount of the scholarship will be determined by the selection committee. However, grants typically range from \$800 to \$1,000.

Eligibility: Students must have a 3.0 GPA, be U.S. citizens, and have submitted a complete application for the Italian Studies summer study abroad program.

Students must also intend to take the Medicine and Compassion course on the Italian Studies program.

Selection: The selection process will be competitively based upon a combination of financial need and academic merit.

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship

Eligibility

The Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program is open to all U.S. citizen undergraduates, in good academic standing, who meet the criteria listed below:

- Receiving a Federal Pell Grant at the time of application or during the study program
- Applying to or has been accepted into a study abroad program eligible for credit
- Studying abroad in any country except Cuba or a country on the U.S. Department of State's current Travel Warning list.

• Studying abroad for at least four weeks in one country.

Corinne Jeannine Schillings Foundation – Academic Scholarship to Study a Foreign Language

- The *Foundation* will award scholarships to deserving young women who have attained at least the honor of **Silver Award Girl Scout**, and who plan to or are currently pursuing a major/minor in foreign language at a <u>four year</u> college/university. The scholarship provides \$1,500 per academic year. The scholarship may be renewed three times following the initial award, for a total \$6,000 maximum award. Scholarship renewal is <u>not</u> automatic, however, and awardees must submit the renewal application and all required attachments each year.

Corinne Jeannine Schillings Foundation – Scholarship to Study Abroad

• The *Foundation* will support Silver or Gold Award Girl Scouts who plan to study abroad, irrespective of major/minor.

It is not necessary to be a *Scholarship to Study a Foreign Language* recipient to apply for this one time Study Abroad scholarship; nor are *Scholarship to Study a Foreign Language* recipients excluded from applying. The *Scholarship to Study Abroad* IS NOT renewable. Applications may be submitted for studying abroad during first semester, second semester, summer, or the full academic year. Summer programs must be at least six weeks long.

National Security Education Program David L. Boren Scholarship

The merit based Boren Scholarships are designed to strengthen national security by providing opportunities for students to study cultures and languages important to U.S. national security. The NSEP expands international educational opportunities for U.S. students, particularly those who may have little or no previous experience overseas and who may need financial assistance to participate in study abroad. NSEP requirements include selecting a program of study in all countries except for Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand. The integrated study of foreign language is required for all proposals. All recipients of the award are required to complete a service component as part of the scholarship program.

The maximum award is \$8,000 for summer, \$10,000 for semester, and \$20,000 for academic year.

**A student interested in the Boren scholarship would need to combine one of Emory's summer programs with another summer program or combine the summer program with a fall semester study abroad in order to be eligible. Contact <u>CIPA@emory.edu</u> if questions regarding this scholarship.
