



STUDY ABROAD FINANCIAL AID, SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

General Information on Financial Aid and Scholarships for Study Abroad

Emory Semester Programs: If you enroll in an Emory Semester Program, you can utilize all the same financial aid for which you would qualify on campus. This includes federal financial aid, state financial aid, Emory scholarships and other "outside" scholarships. In addition, CIPA administers the CIPA Study Abroad Grant.

Emory Summer Programs: All Emory College students who qualify are considered by the Office of Financial Aid for a summer aid award after registration in Emory summer study abroad courses. The amount of the award depends on the number of credit hours and current financial aid package. Students currently receiving financial aid from Emory are typically eligible. A limited number of CIPA Summer Study Abroad Travel Grants are also available.

Non-Emory Semester Programs: If you are enrolled in a Non-Emory semester program, you can utilize federal financial aid, state financial aid, and some "outside" scholarships. Emory scholarships do not apply to these programs.

Types of Financial Aid

Grants and Scholarships: Usually provide funding that does not need to be repaid, based on talent, financial need or affiliation. Types of aid include Federal Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, Emory University Grants, Georgia Tuition Equalization / HOPE Grant, Georgia Student Incentive Grant, Student Courtesy Scholarship, and outside scholarships (such as government, corporate or community agency funding). Scholarships listed under "Other Resources for Study Abroad" are administered by outside institutions.

Work Study: If you currently have a work study job on campus or off-campus, you may qualify for a replacement grant during your semester abroad. The replacement grant is based on the average of the

prior two semesters' earnings and can amount to as much as \$1000 for the semester.

Loans: Are available from various sources, including federal and state governments, the University and private lenders. Students must pay back student loans. Types of loans include: Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Subsidized Stafford Loan, Unsubsidized Stafford Loan, Federal PLUS Loans, and Emory University Loans.

Note: Scholarships are readily available. The assumption that they are too competitive or too time consuming is not true. The extra time and effort required to file an application can be very economically rewarding.

The grant can be used to offset airfare and other travel-related expenses for an Emory-approved semester or summer program abroad. All students are now required to physical turn in a copy of their unofficial transcript to CIPA as a Material Submission.

JAPAN

AIEJ Scholarship (Association of International Education) in Japan

Students receive a monthly stipend of Y80,000 round trip airfare to Osaka, and arrival allowance of Y25,000 in Osaka. Deadline: April 1 (for the following academic year in Japan)

Bridging Scholarships for Study in Japan

The Association of Teachers of Japanese Bridging Project is accepting applications from American students participating in study-abroad programs in Japan beginning in Fall 2005. Funding from private foundations and major U.S. corporations has made it possible for ATJ to award 100 scholarships annually to assist students with the travel and living expenses they will incur while studying abroad in Japan. Contributors to the scholarship fund include Boeing Japan, Citigroup, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu, The Freeman Foundation, Lockheed Martin, Merrill Lynch, Morgan Stanley, PricewaterhouseCoopers and ChuoAoyama Audit Corp., Shinsei Bank, The Starr Foundation, TCS Japan, and Weyerhaeuser.

Undergraduate students majoring in any field of study are eligible to apply for these scholarships. Japanese language study is not a prerequisite. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents and be enrolled in a college or university in the United States. (For a list of the most recent recipients of the Bridging Scholarship, scroll down to the bottom of this page.)

Bridging Scholarship recipients receive a stipend of \$2,500 (for students on semester-long programs) or \$4,000 (for students on academic year programs).

Applications for Bridging Scholarships are accepted twice a year: the next deadline, for students who will be studying in Japan beginning in Fall 2005, will be April 5, 2005. Scholarships for Fall 2005 will be awarded to 60 students.

The Benjamin A. Gilman Scholarship is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. This program provides awards for study abroad, for U.S. citizens or U.S. national students who are receiving federal need-based financial aid under Title IV. Title IV student financial aid includes Pell Grants, Federal Work-Study, Stafford Loans, Perkins Loans, and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants. The merit based NSEP scholarships are designed to strengthen national security by providing opportunities for students to study cultures and languages important to U.S. national security. The NSEP expands international educational opportunities for U.S. students, particularly those who may have little or no previous experience overseas and who may need financial assistance to participate in study abroad. NSEP requirements include selecting a program of study in all countries except for Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand. The integrated study of foreign language is required for all proposals. All recipients of the award are required to complete a service component as part of the scholarship program. The maximum award is \$8,000 for summer, \$10,000 for semester, and \$20,000 for academic year.
